

The annual meeting of the Lake Kampeska Water Project District will be held Tuesday, April 26, 2016, at 7 p.m., at Lunkers, 100 North Lake Drive.

The Lake Kampeska Water Project District was formed in 1986 with the election of a seven-member board of directors. As a local agency, it is tasked with protecting the water resources of Lake Kampeska by implementing projects to improve water quality and flood protection. Each board member serves a three-year term, elected on a rotating basis.

Current directors are: Paul Hinderaker, Chairman, Greg Blow, Sarah Caron, Brad Johnson, John Wiles, Doug Modica and Mark Messerli.

The seats held by Blow, Caron and Modica are up for election.

Petitions for election to the Lake Kampeska Water Project District board are now available, according to Hinderaker. Anyone who is the owner of record of property on Lake Kampeska and at least 18 years of age is eligible for election to the board.

Petitions to run for election to the board must be signed by at least 25 people who own property on Lake Kampeska.

The notarized petition must be filed with the secretary of Lake Kampeska Water Project District by Friday, March 25, 2016. Petitions are available at the office of Austin, Hinderaker, Hopper, Strait & Benson LLP, 25 First Avenue Southwest, Watertown. Completed petitions must be returned to the same address.
